Student Scholarships

A generous grant from the National Science Foundation will provide participation support through a limited number of travel scholarships for students to attend the 12th Annual Green Chemistry & Engineering Conference in Washington, DC, June 23-26, 2008.

The 2008 NSF Student Scholars program will reimburse students for travel, accommodations, and registration fees to attend the conference, up to a maximum grant size of one thousand dollars (US \$1,000). Individual grants sizes will vary depending upon need.
