## Grenoble Science Program

New for Fall 2009!

The new Grenoble Science Program, offered only during the Fall semester, is an ideal choice for pre-health and other science students. This unique program combines science coursework with French language study at all levels, in a beautiful alpine setting. The design of the program allows students to take courses that fit neatly into their existing curricula and requirements.

Upon successful completion of the program students earn 16 Boston University credits.

### Courses

#### Required Course

CAS LF 113 Intensive Beginning French, 4 cr.

*(Students who have studied French previously can enroll in a four-credit language course at the intermediate or advanced level.)*

#### Elective Courses

Students choose three out of the following courses (taught in English):

CAS CH 203 Organic Chemistry I, 4 cr.

CAS BI 203 Cell Biology, 4 cr.

CAS MA 213 Basic Statistics and Probability, 4 cr.

IP 400 French Culture elective, 4 cr.

#### Optional Additional Elective Course

In addition to the required language course and three four-credit electives, students may take the following two-credit course for a total of 18 credits:

CAS NS 291 Introduction to Scientific Research, 2 cr.

### Program Administration

#### Host Institution

The Université de Grenoble dates from the fourteenth century and has a distinguished tradition of excellence in science, arts and letters. Its beautiful setting in the French Alps provides an excellent university atmosphere for students in the program.

#### Housing

All students are provided with accommodations in French households throughout the city, to facilitate language learning and to integrate them into daily life. Students are given a single room, breakfast, and a specified number of evening meals per month in the home. They receive an allowance for local transportation and for meals not taken with their hosts.



#### Admissions

- Minimum GPA: 3.0 (overall)
- No prior knowledge of French is required
- Students must have completed the prerequisite requirements for CAS CH 203 and CAS BI 203

#### Program Dates

Fall Semester: late August to late December

#### Application Deadline

Fall Semester: March 15

#### Program Cost

2008/2009 Tuition and Fees: \$23,979 per semester  
Cost includes tuition, housing, board, partial books, excursions, round-trip group airfare from a designated US city, and emergency travel assistance coverage. The cost for Fall 2009 has not yet been announced. Financial aid is available.
